STUDY: SPRAYS WITH DEET, PMD BEST AT KEEPING **MOSQUITOES AT BAY**

A recent study conducted by New Mexico State University and published in the Entomological Society of America's Journal of Insect Science found that the most effective protection against mosquitos is still spray-on products containing DEET (diethyltoluamide) or PMD (p-Menthane-3,8-diol). Of the products tested, "wearable" devices and sonic repellants were largely found to be ineffective in repelling Aedes aegypti mosquitoes, the species that can spread the Zika virus.


